He never knew “blessed” meant happy . . .

It is an age-old story of a small-town boy raised to fear and respect God . . . working hard after high school . . . partying with friends on the weekends . . . then suffering an injury that leads to opioid addiction. Many know someone with this same story. It is tragically a growing epidemic.

“I was terrified of withdrawals, so I quit getting sober. Then I found myself homeless with a choice to make at my final rehab hospital.”

Richard’s story is a familiar one. The slide into addiction is slippery. It is easy to one day look up and find yourself so far gone it is hard to realize the world could be different. However, like so many who find themselves here at the Durham Rescue Mission, God stepped into the picture, and a new life began to unfold for this broken young man.

Richard was sitting in a hospital and had to determine his next step to find sobriety and a roof over his head. After calling down the list of facilities, he reached the Mission. He was told we didn’t have an open bed, but we would find one for him. He was given twenty dollars for a tank of gas that brought him and a friend to the Mission doors. As they pulled into the Mission, the car died; as if God was Himself saying, “This is it . . . this is where you are to be.”

He was scared and timid, but he was encouraged by the other clients who knew the difficulty of becoming and

staying sober. Circumstances forced Richard to lift his head to heaven and ask God for help; his heart and his mind were then opened to the programs that the Mission offers. He entered the Victory Program, where he truly learned about God and God’s endless love for us all. **For the first time in his life, he “knew” God and he felt blessed and happy in a deeply fulfilling way that the world does not provide.**

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.” (Matthew 6:33). Richard started trusting God and putting Him first. Even on hard days, he would write over and over “Trust in the Lord.” Five years sober, Richard is now working in the Durham Rescue Mission Development Department.

When you faithfully support the Mission, your donations pass over Richard’s desk and remind him that your support enables the Durham Rescue Mission to help anyone who is seeking a life free from addiction; especially those who have no other means like Richard.

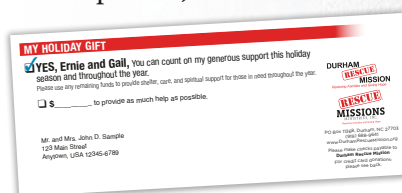
