My name is Marcus. I didn’t think it would happen to me. I came out of the service a captain. I had responsibilities. I was a leader of men. I was respected. But before I knew it, *I couldn’t even lead myself.* I became a prodigal son. I was addicted to drugs. I found myself with no clothes and no food. I didn’t live in a pigsty like the Prodigal Son, but how about a cardboard box? That was my home. When the rains came, I got soaking wet. I was hungry, cold and far from God. Problem was . . . *I didn’t think I had a problem.*

As my condition worsened, I was going down, down, down. My life was a living nightmare. I had abandoned my children and continued to hang out with people who were

not really my friends. Then, one day, God directed my steps to the Durham Rescue Mission — a place that is changing my life.

My relationship with God is making all the difference.

I praise God the relationships with my family are being restored. Last March I got married, and now I’m in the apprenticeship program at the Mission. I’m also studying marketing at Strayer University. What a difference a few months make . . . *when God takes over a man’s life.*

But Jesus is giving me the strength to forgive those who hurt me, abuse that began when I was five years old. I'm no longer wallowing in my past. Instead, I'm asking God each day to keep me positive as I see His will. I'm replacing anger with trust. I spend my

days with women who encourage me . . . and who allow me to reach out to them.

I also want to thank you for your support of the Mission. You keep this place running. Because of your donations, I have found the help I needed to become a productive member of society. Today, I have a job and I just don't have the words to express the depth of my gratitude to you. Because of God, the Mission and your encouragement, I'm becoming the woman God wants me to be. Stewards Fund Challenge Grant

The Stewards Fund of Raleigh has issued the Durham Rescue Mission a \$65,000 Challenge Grant beginning October 1, 2012 and ending January 31, 2013. This challenge is an "All or None" challenge. This means if we raise \$65,000, we will receive \$65,000 from the Stewards Fund, making a grand total of \$130,000. If we fail to raise \$65,000, we will not receive any of the additional funds.

The Stewards Fund, in their effort to help our ministry, will match dollar for dollar any financial gifts given by new donors who give during the challenge. This is a wonderful time to share the ministries of the Durham Rescue Mission with your family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and civic club members and ask them to consider a first-time gift.
