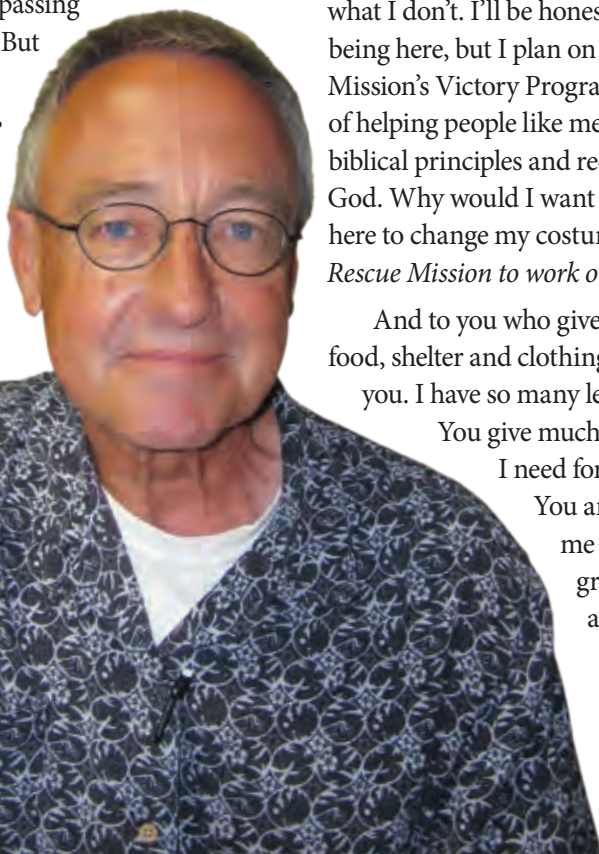


Thank you for the safe haven . . . and for the opportunity to take a good look at my life

My name is Mykel. I found myself at this gas station in a rough part of the country. The level valve on my big rig had gone bad and there I was, stuck in the middle of nowhere. It was 3 a.m. *Not a good place to be at 3 a.m.* In all the confusion, I'd lost my bag and all my documents. Out of the darkness, I felt a hand on my shoulder. This guy took me somewhere and told me to stay inside. My choices were slim. It was a cold November.

At the time I had a passing interest in Jesus Christ. But even though I was in a compromised situation, I wasn't about to settle

for a foxhole conversion. I knew all about atheists doing things like that. As it turned out, this man and his wife had rescued me. I can't go into all the details, but two weeks later they brought me to Durham Rescue Mission. Probably not the way most people come through these doors.

But here I am . . . getting my life back in balance . . . re-evaluating what I believe and what I don't. I'll be honest. It's not easy being here, but I plan on sticking with the Mission's Victory Program that has the goal of helping people like me understand biblical principles and reconcile them with God. Why would I want to leave? I'm not here to change my costume; *I'm at Durham Rescue Mission to work on my character.*

And to you who give me so much — food, shelter and clothing — I say thank you. I have so many levels of appreciation.

You give much more than what I need for physical survival. You are also helping me understand what grace and mercy are all about.
