God, you know I'm a good person, don't you?* All that was well and good, but down deep I didn't know Jesus. So the day my life fell apart, I had no place to turn.

I had been a property manager for many years, but when the company was sold, I lost my job — and eventually my life savings. The day I was no longer employed I felt like I'd died. I went into a deep depression, walking around in a cloud. I stopped checking the mail. Why bother? I couldn't pay my bills anyway. It got so bad I attempted to take my life. I'm grateful I received help by spending some time in a psych ward. Killing myself would've been a cowardly act.





Paul said in Ephesians 4:1, "I... beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called."

Most Christians miss the theological truths bursting from this verse because they limit "vocation" to their job. Vocation is not limited to one's job. As we read the rest of Ephesians we see Paul instructing believers about marriage (5:21-33); about raising children (6:1-4), and about work relationships (6:5-9).

Christians are constantly looking for their "callings or vocations," but we fail to recognize our marriages, children, and even our ministries in our local churches as "vocations" we are called to do. Frankly, many men miss God's blessings on their jobs, because they are slack in their vocations at home and church.
